Please find some information below about what's been happening in school over the last few weeks and some future events.

Messy Church

Sports Crew

Our Sports crew have been busy running different activities each lunch time. The children have shown how responsible they are by organising the playground, the resources and running a lunchtime club every day to encourage our children to stay active and healthy – well done to our Sports Crew!

Gymnastics

The children have thoroughly enjoying our gymnastic sessions and their hard work in school paid off at the gymnastics competition. They were amazing ambassadors for our school, were great team members and came very close to reaching the final with Tigers coming fourth overall.

Ambassadors and the Fruit shop

The Ambassadors are taking part in a project with other local schools named 'eat, sleep, get fit and repeat'. The children are devising ways to encourage us all to stay healthy. One of the ideas the children have had has been to set up a fruit tuck shop each day. This is now running at break time and children can bring in 10p each day to purchase a healthy snack. This has followed on from our ambassador visit to Minskip Farm Shop. Please see Austin and Daisy's report below.

'Yesterday, we went on a trip to Minskip Farm Shop and learnt about how the farmers grow their food. The shop was made out of wood and sold all sorts, such as: eggs, cheese, jam, fruit and vegetables. We went outside onto the farm area and looked at some pigs. Their names were Mudd, Violet and Bangers. The lady that was leading us through the farm (Emma) told us that the pig`s manure helped



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all the plants grow. In winter, the farmers have something called the hunger gap which is a time where not many crops grow, apart from some including kale and potatoes. Later, we visited the chicken spa. The leader told us about how the chickens are very well looked after and how they have toys, warmth and fresh straw to make them comfortable so that they can lay eggs. Because the farm is so close to the shop it means that there is a low carbon footprint getting food to the customer which is good for the environment. We highly recommend that you visit the farm shop at Minskip.'

Forest School

Forest School continues for Panthers this term. They have been learning about how animals can survive in different habitats. In addition to this they have been den building, fire starting and have even made camp fire pizzas!

Cookery

Mrs Brassington has started to volunteer to cook with the children each week linked to their topics in class. The children have been making 'Picadillo' which is a South American dish consisting of mince, salt, pepper, onions, red pepper and spices which was delicious! Everyone in school will get a chance to cook at some point this term so look out for your home delivery of something tasty!

Busy starts

We are always looking for ways in which to involve parents in school life. This term we are going to introduce 'busy starts' which will be held once a half term. On busy start sessions, parents will be able to come into school at the start of the day with their children and support/take part in their learning. Our first busy start will be held on **Thursday 13th February at 8.45 – 9.15am** and is a 'library busy start'. You will be able to come into school, enjoy some time in the library or go to class and enjoy some reading time with your child. Future busy starts will each have a different focus such as 'maths calculation' or 'phonics'. We hope that these sessions will allow you to see some of the teaching and learning the children take part in and ask any questions about this you may have.
