Monday was a very interesting day for both staff and pupils. Whilst the children had a great time taking part in some fantastic activities, the staff were engaged in some very thought provoking training. Working with our colleagues from Kirkby, we were inspired by Chris Quigley, developing ideas to enhance our curriculum and develop new learning opportunities. We have further time together pencilled in to plan our themes for next year to enable us to work together more closely. As we prepare for next year, the children are spending time in their new classes. September, Tiger class (YR/1/2) will be taught by Miss Mandelson all day on Monday and Tuesday and in the morning on Wednesday. Mrs Duffy will teach Tigers on Wednesday afternoons, Thursdays and Fridays. Jaguar Class (Y3/4/5) will be taught by Miss Asker Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday whilst Lion class (Y6) will be taught by Mrs Hatch every morning. On a Thursday morning and part of Friday morning they will be joined by Jaguar class. Jaguars will also go swimming on a Friday morning. On an afternoon, Jaguars and Lions will work together - there will be 25 children who will work with Miss Asker, joined by Mrs Hatch on a Wednesday. We have some new teachers joining us on a Thursday and Friday afternoon: On a Thursday Mr Powell will continue to teach sports with KS2 and Mrs Harris will join us to teach music across the school. The children met Mrs Harris when she came into school to lead a music assembly and again at our 'Creative Day'. Mr Houghton, who has worked with the children before, will work with KS2 on a Friday and he will lead Forest Schools. It will be an exciting and enriching year.
