#### School council

The school council have taken on a new project this term following the renovation of the outdoor classroom and the garden area. This area has been handed over to the school council. They are canvassing children's views as to how they would like to develop this area. There has been lots of talk of wild flowers, vegetables and bug hotels. We are all excited to see their proposals in the next few weeks and to see how this develops. Mrs McNamara has also kindly donated some seeds and compost to school. These have been handed over to the school council who will decide where to plant them.



#### Outdoor area development

You may have noticed that we have been having some work done on the outdoor area for Tiger class. The area has been cleared, with old sheds and resources removed and the Astroturf replaced to extend the natural grassy area. We also plan on raising the Tiger outdoor patio area in order to level this out; this will be fenced and will become fit for use for our outdoor classroom. We are also installing raised beds where the plant beds are now, so the children can enjoy more opportunities to garden and grow their own produce.
